• The City's branch recycle site is located just north of the Louisville Cemetery on Empire Road. The site is open to residents the first full weekend of each month from 8 am-4 pm to drop off woody plant material like tree and shrub debris. For more information, contact the City at 303.335.4733.



- The City offers a refuse, recycling and composting program as part of its service through Western Disposal. In addition to weekly pickup, customers are eligible for a free quarterly pickup of a large or bulky item on regular collection day. Contact Western's Customer Service Department at 303.444.2037 for questions.
- Boulder County residents can bring hazardous home, yard, workshop and garage materials that need to be disposed of to the Hazardous Materials Management Facility Wednesday through Saturday 8:30 am-4:30 pm at 1901 63rd Street. - The Recreational Vehicle Dump Station is located at 1000 Empire Road and is available to residents and non-residents. The RV Dump Station is generally open year round Sunday through Saturday 7 am-7 pm. For more information, visit www.LouisvilleCO.gov/RVDumpStation.
- Please contact Code Enforcement at 303.441.4444 if you spot an abandoned or inoperable vehicle (i.e. flat tires, weeds growing around it, mechnical issues) on public property that may require removal.
