Moving Forward: Overview of Boards & Commissions

The City has 14 boards and commissions that cover a variety of areas. A few boards have final decision making authority on a limited number of topics; most boards offer advice and recommendations to the City Council as the Council is setting policy. Each board was created by Resolution with a defined role.

Historical Commission

Library Board of Trustees
Local Licensing Authority
Open Space Advisory Board
Parks & Public Landscaping Board
Planning Commission

Recreation Advisory Board Revitalization Commission Sustainability Advisory Board Youth Advisory Board

Some recommendations to Council regarding boards could include:

- EDI Training for all board/commission members
- Review the resolution defining the role of each board to see where EDI tasks or focus could be added
- Creation of a standing EDI board


