

# **Emergency alerts are a layered approach**

- You
- Door to door
- Neighbors helping neighbors
- Everbridge alerting
  - Landlines
  - o Opt-ins
  - Texts
  - Emails
  - Faxes

- IPAWS/WEA
- Sirens
- Social media with PIO involvement



## **Terminology - Alert Severity**

### Advisory

 Informational message about a situation that is likely to impact one of the addresses listed in an opt-in profile or a registered landline. Advisory messages will not be disseminated on the IPAWS system by dispatch personnel.

## Warning

 Messaging which encourages recipients to prepare to act due to an emergency in their immediate area. Individuals needing extra time due to animals or friends or family members who have functional needs should consider taking immediate action when a warning notification is issued. Warning messages will not be disseminated on the IPAWS system.

#### Order

 Messaging intended to have the recipient take the listed required action immediately due to an imminent threat to life.


## Terminology -Action Requested


- Evacuation

  - Consider all-hazards or flood polygons
  - Consider a radius






## Developing the Footprint


## Less simple


- Custom shape drawn on a map; email/text to dispatch
- Least desirable
  - Verbally relayed over the phone or radio







# Integrated Public Alert and Warning System (IPAWS)

- Wireless Emergency Alerts (WEA)
- Emergency Alert System (EAS)
- Inconsistent delivery impacts due to cell carrier distribution
- WEA and EAS are VOLUNTARY
- Escalating law enforcement incidents; potential to alert suspect of victim hiding spots




## IPAWS Message Impacts

- WEA Version
  - Character limitation
    - Version 1 phones allow 90 characters
    - Version 2 and 3 phones allow 360 characters
  - o 100 vertices limitation
  - 10 shape limit
- App redistribution challenge




