RAB meeting

- Abby presented at RAB Sept meeting; wanted idea of tennis court reno update, median update
- Wanted to revise joint sub-committee to address future courts (tennis and pickle ball) to discuss overlapping items
- Cynthia and Shannon to represent PPLAB at these joint meetings
- Discuss what their priorities are and see how we can align with our priorities or how PPLAB can provide input

Priority overlaps with other groups (RAB, OSAB)

- Dog Park, multi-purpose fields, pickle ball courts Items not on Parks work plan but can be integrated into Cottonwood master plan
- Some questions/comments about pickle ball as a priority:
 - Tennis court resurfacing is a capital improvement request can we combine with pickle ball overlay?
 - How much area is needed for pickle ball (what are ideal space requirements)? Nothing less than 100 ft. but closer to 500+ft due to noise (further away, better).
 - O Cricket field behind rec center can we do anything with this space?
 - O How are they measuring the increase demand for pickle ball? Is there more of a demand for indoor pickle ball?
 - What's the difference in maintenance between pickle ball court and turf? Abby can look into and bring those figures?
 - There are pickle ball courts on inline skate park area but are often not used - don't want to necessarily add resources that aren't needed
 - O Abby has some ideas that may be good spaces for courts
 - O Do we have any other spaces that aren't residential where pickle ball could go?
 - Abby can provide footprint sizes for pickle ball, multi-use fields, etc.
- Meditation areas being discussed for incorporation within parks up for renovation (Sunflower)

Bee City - John

- Booth space for Ecotober southernmost loop near dog park
 - O Will have 10 x 10 pop-up and will have 1' x 6' banner (\$50)
 - O Have some volunteers (2-6PM) on Saturday afternoon
 - o Talk about bees, how to plant with native plants
 - Form for collecting email, resource for native plants and water-wise gardening for pollinators, bee city flier
 - O Signs for folks who want to reg. gardens
 - Talk about art in school programs
 - O Bought colored pipe cleaners to make bees out of popsicle sticks
 - Will also have some posters that were donated
- Patricia has done work with schools and in the midst of promoting art in schools

- Pollinator garden projects in elementary schools contacting schools
- How to deal with pests and weed control walk on Davidson Mesa to look at weed control strategies for open space
 - o would like to integrate Louisville city's pages
- Walked through arboretum; turf in arboretum is not really turf.
 - Long-term can we create a prairie landscape / more natural restoration of area?
 - Lots of missing tree signs. Look at adding into budget for future years?
 - Also add into budget: Xeric/native plants and perhaps some bee houses?

Glyphosate use

- Golf course DOES use Round-up (glyphosate) can we deal with weeds in the fairway another way? Damaging to pollinators, soil biota, etc.
- Parks has not used any pesticides since 2020; using organic fertilizers in some spaces but very cognizant of what is being used
- Balancing pest management vs. planting more pollinator-friendly plants
- O Can reduce weed population with proper management
- Dark sky lightning ordinance did not pass
 - Downtown business community concern with retrofitting parking lot which could be costly
 - No provision of residential light trespass
 - O Street lights are not under control of Louisville (under Xcel); still glare at street level and still trespass on residential properties
 - We are surrounded by areas that don't have restrictions
 - Next steps: public education for now; perhaps follow on statewide level
 - o Westcliff, CO went dark sky in 2015
 - Killing bugs at night with these lights

- How could you roll dark sky education into pollinator / bee city discussion?
- Ceres society came out with a video showing reduction of insects on the planet (in part, lighting for night-flying insects)

Arboretum - Ellen

- Arboretum has been a work in progress city did plant new trees on arbor day to replace those lost in fire
- Replacement plaques constant battle to replace signs
- 10-12 reservations this summer for arboretum
- Fairy house walk going on now
- Xeric demo garden there years ago had drip irrigation but design of raised berms collected weed seed with wind and no staff to maintain; ripped out when pergola area redone

Weed management

- Goats under contract for Open Space
- Today was last day for cattle on Davidson Mesa
- Goats on unirrigated park property for fire mitigation there are some potential spaces (cricket pitch, power line trail)
- Grant for support of maintaining buffer zones
- Looking into weighing mowing vs. grazing in Open Space and Parks

Other comments

- New piece of sidewalk on regal near centennial park and poop sign was removed; isn't one in Centennial Park and it does need to be used
- City Calendar being shown in Rec Center helpful to see but was outdated

Seed Paper making project

Parks, Recreation, and Open Space Communications update- Ginger Cross

Moving into 2024, communications will continue to support and champion the parks division's efforts in providing top-notch recreational spaces and services to our community. I work closely with Abby and Bryon, and our director to ensure that the public is well-informed about various initiatives, including Capital Improvement Projects (CIP), like Meadows and Joe Carnival Park. I also keep the community updated on everyday activities such as mowing and waste collection, promoting a clean and safe environment for all.

This year parks communications included the new surfacing at Community Dog Park, new fencing, tree pruning, mowing, becoming a Bee City Affiliate, medians, and the removal of tree on 88th street.

To enhance our outreach, the City is in the process of transitioning to a new email platform, which will streamline the dissemination of segmented information, ensuring that residents receive updates tailored to their interests. Additionally, we actively use other communication platforms, such as our website and social media to engage with the public, making it easier for everyone to stay connected and informed about the latest developments in our city's parks and recreational services.
