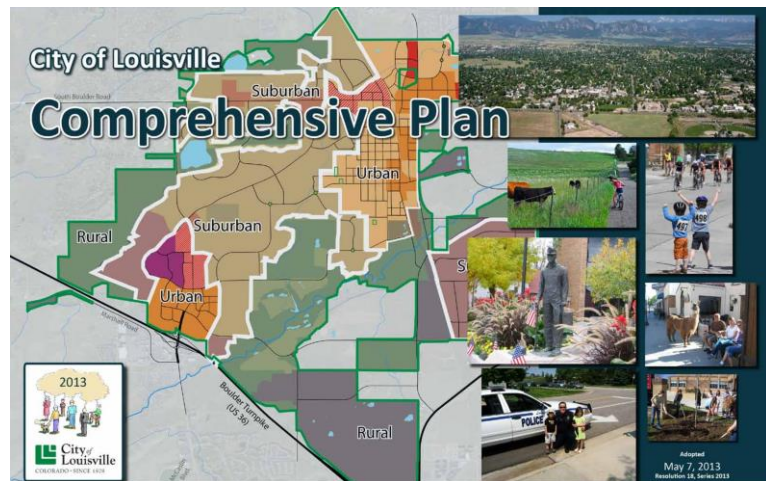

Re: Comprehensive Plan Update

We consider the Youth Advisory Board to be Louisville experts with opinions about the future of your hometown we want to hear more about. Specifically, Louisville’s city planners want to hear from the YAB about one of the city’s most important projects that shapes our future – the “Comprehensive Plan”. At the May 2 meeting, City staff will walk the group through what city planning is, what the Comprehensive Plan is and why it is important and ask a few questions. What we hear from the YAB will help the project team figure out what to do next.

What is a Comprehensive Plan?

A Comprehensive Plan is Louisville’s playbook for the future growth and development of the city. Think of all things related to the “built environment” like buildings, roads, and parks. Think of where people live, where they go to school or work, where they play, what these places look and feel like and how you get to and from them. The Comprehensive Plan tackles all these subjects and gets updated every ten years. Now is the time for such an update.

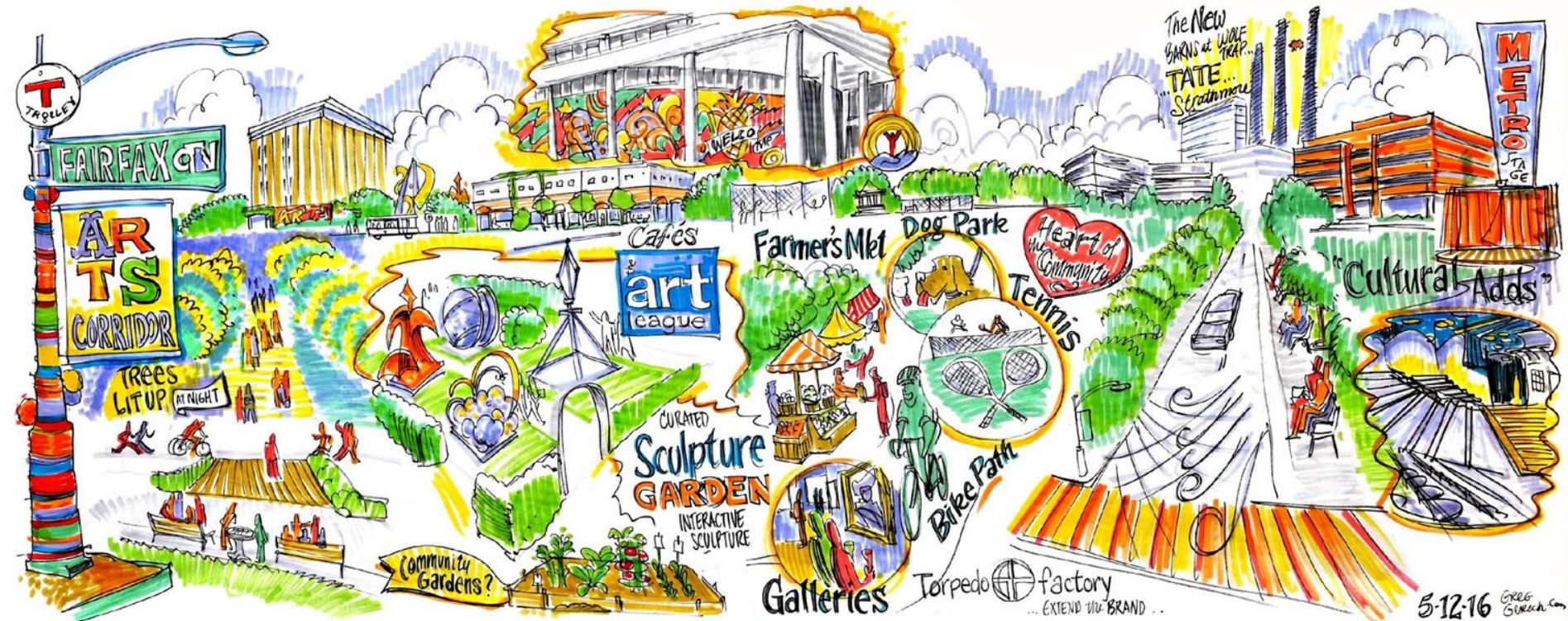

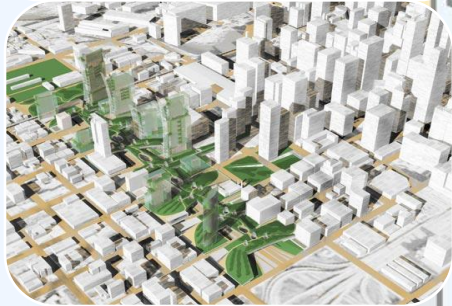


What is Planning?

Planning shapes cities, towns, regions, and even rural areas.



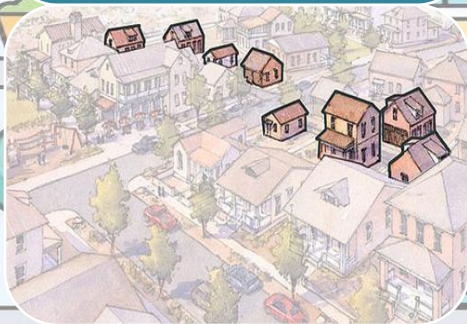
Planning creates the vision and goals for the community, identifies current issues, analyzes trends, engages community members about challenges and opportunities.

Planning helps create communities of lasting value, offering better choices for where and how people work and live!



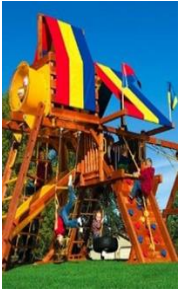
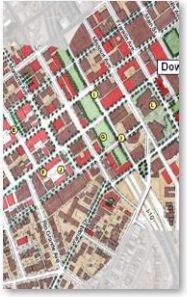
Planning is called urban planning, city planning, or regional planning.

WHAT DO PLANNERS DO?

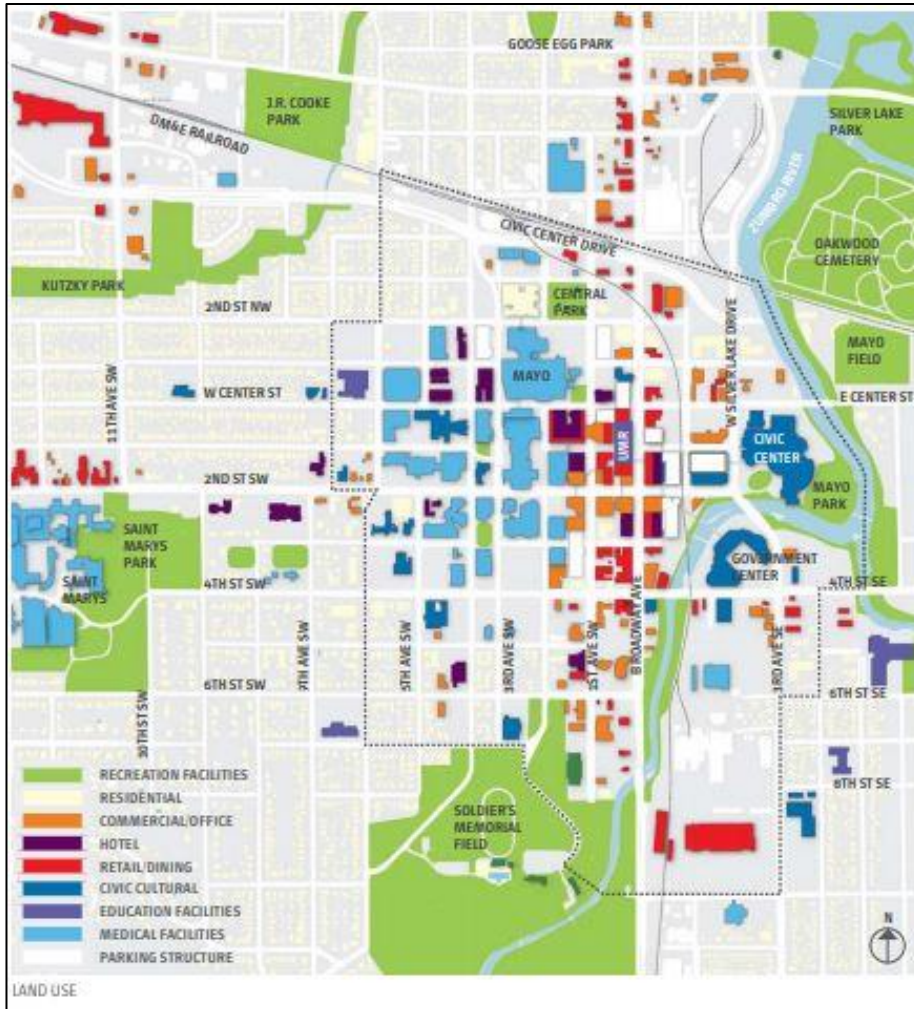
An urban planner is a professional who works to enhance the quality of life. They help shape the design and form of a city or place, from buildings to roads, and parks and more, and work hard to ensure the community is a great place to live, work, and play!

WHAT IS LAND USE?

Land Use is a planning method by which each parcel or piece of land is categorized for what the land is intended to be used for on a broad scale. Categories such as Residential, Commercial, Industrial, Parks and Open Space, etc. are used to define the use of land.

WHAT IS ZONING?

Zoning is the process of dividing land in a municipality into zones (e.g. residential, industrial) in which certain land uses are permitted or prohibited. Example: Zoning Designation: Commercial, Permitted Uses: Retail, Shopping, Hotels, Offices, Restaurants). Zoning includes a zoning ordinance to explain the regulations and a zoning map to show the land use.
