However, I do not think this proposed artwork is appropriate. First, this is a fly, not a bee! (Note that it has only one pair of wings, not two.) Second, this insect has an ominous look that will be especially apparent at the large size of the finished mural.

I'd strongly advocate for artwork that represents a native bumblebee that is landing on colorful flowers to highlight a Colorado insect that is actively pollinating, thus representing the intended theme of the mural.
